#### LIFE CYCLE OF THE EMERALD ASH BORER **Emerald Ash Borer** (enlarged view) Female ash borers lay 40 to 70 eggs on the bark of an ash tree. After hatching, the larvae bore into the tree layers just below the bark to feed. They remain there for 1 or 2 years. then pupate into adults. Actual size 1/2 in. long 1/8 in. wide Adults, which can fly. The adults then chew a telltale then seek out new D-shaped exit hole in the bark. trees, and the process begins again.
